Read Level 4-appropriate irregularly spelled words.</p>	<p>Students continue learning specific strategies for decoding words in texts. Learning prefixes and suffixes along with Latin suffixes enhances decoding, spelling ability, and vocabulary development.</p> <p>Use questions and prompts such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Does that sound right? • Does that look right? • Does that make sense? • Look at the end of the word and try that again. • Look for chunks you know and say them. • Look at the word, does it look like ...? • You said ...does it look like ...?

<p>4. Read with sufficient accuracy and fluency to support comprehension.</p> <p>a. Read Level 4 text with purpose and understanding.</p> <p>b. Read Level 4 prose and poetry orally with accuracy, appropriate rate, and expression.</p> <p>c. Use context to confirm or self-correct word recognition and understanding, rereading as necessary.</p>	<p>Fluency helps the reader process language for meaning and enjoyment. Fluent readers are able to focus attention on the meaning of the text. Readers at this stage still benefit from opportunities to read texts multiple times at an independent level.</p> <p>Use questions and prompts such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make your reading sound like the characters are talking. • Go back and reread when it doesn't sound or look like you think it should.
