**Free Account** -You can set up a free account that allows you to make 2 storyboards / week, or you can pay to upgrade your account for \$10/month and have unlimited storyboards with extra features.

**Benefits of storyboarding:**

Visual / Tactile learners

Can be applied to Reading, Writing, Math, History, or Science (see below)

Builds creativity

Enjoyable activity to show learning

**Uses of StoryboardThat:**

Here are some ideas across the curriculum. *What ideas can you add?*

Reading:

Sequencing (Beginning, Middle, End of a story you read)

Showing the themes in a story

Character Maps (What does the character look like, say, act like, think)

Identifying elements of the plot (Setting, Rising Action, Climax, Conflict/Resolution, etc.)

Making connections Text to Text, Text to Self, Text to World

Definitions of vocabulary words

Writing:

Pre-writing activity to plan a fictional story

Make illustrations / Captions to go with a story student wrote

Non-fiction writing - Write about what you learned on a specific topic or what you did on a field trip or vacation

Grammar vocabulary

### Math:

Create word problems and pictures to go with them  
Definitions for math vocabulary

### History and Science:

Show main events from a historical topic or time in history  
Make a timeline  
Showing definitions for history or science related vocabulary  
Show steps in an experiment
